




Annual Meeting: Bournemouth 2009



Ardnamurchan Field Workshop

This year's workshop was held from 5th – 10th September, and paid tribute to the life and works of James Richey, a British Survey Geologist, famous for his research on Ardnamurchan and other Palaeogene volcanic centres in Scotland and Ireland. The meeting attracted workers from the UK, Ireland, Russia, South Africa and Sweden, and we were blessed with glorious sunshine for most of the trip. The group visited key localities that Richey used to develop models of intrusion emplacement and cauldron subsidence, and considered how interpretations of these rocks have changed over subsequent years, with lively debate ensuing.
